SUBJECT: Retiree Self-Service Portal

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

Authorize the Chief Executive Officer to enter into an agreement with the County Department of Technology to develop a retiree self-service portal for approximately \$660,000.

#### **PURPOSE**

This item supports the Strategic Management Plan objective to leverage technology and creative solutions to enhance enterprise performance.

#### **DISCUSSION**

SCERS has been evaluating options to provide the retired membership with an online portal for self-service activities. SCERS has an opportunity to partner with the County Department of Technology to expand its existing self-service portal available to County employees by providing access to SCERS' retirees.

A retiree self-service portal would enhance member services for retired members by providing access to online/paperless monthly pay statements and annual 1099-R forms. Retirees would also be provided online services to enable them to update personal data such as address and email, bank account, and tax withholding status, activities which are currently unavailable using a secure, online service.

The retiree portal would utilize the County's existing platform with multi-factor authentication that can be easily accessed through the SCERS website. The County's self-service web application has been available since 2005, using proven, industry-leading SAP software, and is a popular, known tool for County employees. Extending access to retirees is expected to be relatively seamless and will provide a familiar experience to SCERS members.

The County's self-service portal pulls data from the County's COMPASS payroll system for employees to access paycheck information. Because SCERS also utilizes the County's COMPASS payroll system to administer monthly pension payments to retirees, the data feed is

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already developed and can be easily adapted for a retiree web portal. Full implementation is estimated to take six months, and the portal will be entirely supported by Department of Technology.

The cost is approximately \$660,000 for the initial year, and an annual ongoing cost of approximately \$106,000, subject to inflationary increases. These potential costs have already been included in the 2023-24 SCERS budget.
