#### SCERS BOARD RETIREE MEMBER ELECTION

A Sacramento County Retirement Board Member Election is to be held November 9 through December 7, 2001, for the purpose of electing ONE RETIRED MEMBER for a three year term beginning January 1, 2002 and ending December 31, 2004. William Cox is the current incumbent.

Formal notice by the Sacramento County Registrar of Voters will be mailed out soon.

Only those individuals who are retired members of the Sacramento County Employees' Retirement System as of September 30, 2001, are eligible to be candidates and/or vote in this election.

Nomination documents may be obtained and filed from October 9 through October 19, 2001 at Sacramento County Voter Registration & Elections, 3700 Branch Center Road, Sacramento, 95827. Candidates are to obtain and file their nomination documents in person. If another person is delegated this responsibility, a specific letter of authorization signed by the candidate will be required.

## **SCERS Office Relocation Anticipated**

The Administrative Offices of the Sacramento County Employees' Retirement System ("SCERS") will be <u>moving</u> from existing space on the seventh floor of the U.S. Bank Plaza Building at 980 9h Street, Sacramento, to the eighteenth floor of the same building.

Agreement has been reached between our existing landlord "980 9th Street, LLC" and SCERS to accomplish the move antic i-pated to occur sometime between the period December 10, 2001 through January 10, 2002. If possible, members with casual inquiries should avoid visiting SCERS dur-

(Chicago) —The Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting has been awarded to:

#### Sacramento County Employees' Retirement System, CA

By the Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada (GFOA) for its comprehensive annual financial report (CAFR). The Certificate of Achievement is the highest form of recognition in the area of public employee retirement system (PERS) accounting and financial reporting, and its attainment represents a significant accomplishment.

The CAFR has been judged by an impartial panel to meet the high standards of the program including demonstrating a constructive "spirit of full disclosure" to clearly communicate its financial story and motivate potential users and user groups to read the CAFR.

The GFOA is a nonprofit professional association serving approximately 14,000 government finance professionals with offices in Chicago, Illinois and Washington, D.C.



## **County-Sponsored Annual Enrollments**

The County Human Resources Agency, Department of Risk Management and Benefits has informed SCERS that mailouts of informational material relative to County-sponsored medical plans for retirees are being mailed to SCERS annuitants and should be received the first or second week of October 2001. This information is comprehensive and should be sufficient to explain the various coverages offered by carriers and costs. Such information and knowledge of the existing premium offset schedule, and the ability to ask questions and receive answers at annual enrollment meetings should enable enrollees to make sound and informed decisions.

The premium offset schedule for County-sponsored plans as it exists through June 30, 2002 is set forth below. The offset schedule to be applicable July 1, 2002 is yet to be determined. [Special Note: Legal instruments under which the Sacramento County Retiree Health Care Benefit Program is created provide that the plan does not create any contractual, regulatory, or other vested right or entitlement to either present or future retirees, their spouses or dependents, to any particular level of subsidization of health care costs, or to subsidization at all. Whether subsidization continues, and if so, the level of subsidization is vested within the sole discretion of the Board of Supervisors.]
